We have had a busy year since our 2006 reunion. We had a Golf Tournament which raised \$13,000 and a Haunted House Event which raised \$1,200. Also received was a grant from the Rockwell Foundation for \$5,000 which represents their fifth grant in five years. The Duxbury CPC grant total for the year was \$10,000 for window presentation. Lewis Conant is close to finishing the project.

We also had a Christmas tree sale which raised \$1,500. Our house tour, sponsored by the Duxbury Newcomer's Club, raised \$600. Troop 62 Boy Scout Troop did the fall and spring clean up.

The Town of Duxbury put up two signs giving directions to the Alden House. The Duxbury Rural and Historical Society has put up a new sign giving directions to the many historical landmarks in Duxbury, including the John Alden House.

The National Historic Landmark Designation process includes Geophysical survey by first site, Dan Lynch Soil Sight, LLC. The Historical Landmarks Committee of the National Parks System Advisory Board includes letters from Senator Ted Kennedy and Congressman William Delahunt. The Secretary of the Interior has also been consulted.

The Second Annual Speak for Thyself Awards Dinner will be run by Anne Antonellis, Duxbury Business Association, Newcomers Club and Don Reed. Award winners are Phyllis Godwin, Marianne Leone Cooper and Elizabeth Nightingale. Liquor is donated and Raw Bar "Schucks", silent auction, and Speak for Thyself booklet and music are also donated.

**Minutes of 106th Annual Meeting Alden Kindred of America
Duxbury, Massachusetts
August 5, 2006**

The Annual Meeting of the Alden Kindred of America, Inc. was called to order by Linda Osborne, President at 10:32 a.m., August 5, 2006.

Pauline Kezer gave the invocation. Daniel Duffy led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance which was followed by singing the national anthem.

Alicia Williams introduced our distinguished guest, Carolyn Cardell, representing the Mayflower Society. She then introduced the new members present and we took a few moments to greet everyone.

Business Meeting:

The Minutes of the 2005 Annual Meeting were approved as printed.

Barbara Itz announced the winner of the Donnell B. Young scholarship: Daniel Duffy of Haverhill, PA for his essay on Sports in Pilgrim times. Daniel will be attending Worcester Polytechnic Institution and studying physics. Curator's Report: Jim Baker told of the evolution of the display techniques employed by keepers of the house from the time the Aldens purchased it from the last owners. He also explained that Aunt Polly's room has been redone in the style of 1875 and that he will be tackling Henry's room next and then eventually the downstairs Parlor.

The windows, many of which are in awful shape, are slowly being replaced with a CPC (Community Preservation Commission) grant from the Town of Duxbury.

Director's Report: Rink thanked the local Boy Scouts for their help with clean-up and with the haunted trail. He commented on the Education Committee's Summer Camp which had a successful first season. The always successful Golf Tournament and National Landmark status were also discussed. We are hopeful that we will be accepted at the April 2007 meeting of the National Park System Advisory Board. He also mentioned the newly landscaped front entrance to the property. This is a vast improvement and opens up the property to the view of passerby.

Rink introduced our newest effort at wider recognition; The Speak for Thyself event. This is a dinner dance honoring strong women. We hope that this will bring us

Personnel/Office

We are very happy to introduce our newest staff member, Lilly Cleveland. Curator's Report

As we mentioned last year, we have decided to shift from installing annual gallery exhibits to working on inexpensive publications that may be more widely distributed among the Alden Kindred membership and the public at large. The first of these titles, was *Alden House History: A Work in Progress 2006*, an update on the history of the house written by Dorothy Wentworth 27 years ago with corrections and additions to her original account. Alden House History has been well received and is selling steadily. This year's publication is *Aldens Return to England*, an Alden family guide to Pilgrim England based on the tour we conducted last summer. There is an account of our tour (a shorter version of which was published in the *Alden Home* last fall) and we have added extensive directions about how to find the sites we visited as well as other Pilgrim stops of interest along the way. We hope that Alden family members who may wish to make their own tour in John and Priscilla's footsteps will find this detailed guide of value, but it is an interesting read in its own right. In addition to the main texts, we were fortunate to have Carolyn Bingham provide us with an account of her and George's visit to Bitton, Gloucestershire, where Samuel Alden (who inherited the Alden House from his father, Col. John Alden, in 1739) lived and died, far from his Duxbury birthplace.

The other 2007 publication, prepared especially for the annual meeting, is *An Alden House Album*, an illustrated record of the Alden House to commemorate the 100th anniversary of its purchase by the Alden Kindred of America in 1907. Limited to 100 copies, this little pamphlet provides a visual journey through time of the changes that have occurred in our old house over the past century and a half.

In addition to publications, we have been working on a new database (with the template provided by Alicia Williams) to contain a full catalog of our artifact collections. The earlier one compiled by Bonnie Conant was lost in the upgrade of our computers. Fortunately we have a print-out of the original database, and will be adding to that items acquired since 2002 as well as some which were overlooked in the earlier survey. We now also have a full digital "virtual tour" of not only the Alden House but also the "First Site" and a few landmarks on the original 1627 grant for visitors who are unable to tour the House or visit the First Site by reason of incapacity. It is available on a dedicated computer in the Barn. We had hoped to have copies on disk for sale at this meeting, but were unable to do so.

The Window Reclamation Project is progressing slowly, with about two-thirds of the windows now restored and provided with UV filters. Most of the sashes that remain to be done are in the north wall or in the museum shop ell. The next task to undertake will be the reshingling of the east wall (at a minimum) and we will be letting you all know how you may help us in this vital act of preservation. Another project we are considering is the restoration of "Henry's Room", which will be repapered and furnished to match Aunt Polly's Room as an exhibit of approximately how the house looked in 1876. We have yet to locate an appropriate replica floral wallpaper pattern. Similar efforts are being discussed for the Best Room or Parlor—we already have the promised donation of an appropriate 19th century couch. With our combined efforts and your support, the Alden House's survival will be guaranteed for another century of AKA ownership.

Finance Committee Report

The Alden Kindred of America will barely balance its budget for FY 2007 recording net results that will be approximately \$17,000 less favorable than in 2006. The golf outing, once again came to the rescue providing a comfortable margin, and declines in total contributions was offset by an increase in membership dues. The much needed contribution of rental income and investment income provided \$29,300 in revenue. It should be noted that this was a substantial increase in program revenues.

On the expense side, the payroll and professional fees budgets have gone up substantially (20% and 24% respectively) because of the decline of volunteer work and an increase in compensation required to retain qualified staff. The Alden endowment increased in value by \$27,848 to \$271,924 as of year end.

It is clear that the generosity of the Kindred both to help with operating costs and build the endowment are keys to the future. In the absence of increasing revenues and increasing expenses, the Kindred will risk unbalanced budgets. New and creative fundraising ideas are needed. Hopefully, the Speak for Thyself tradition, which had a slight deficit in 2006, will produce an increasing stream of revenue in future years.

Our total membership is noticeably lower this year because we dropped a large number of members for non payment of dues. Although our By-laws state that members whose dues are arrears more than six months following the mailing of dues notices are to be dropped from the rolls, we have not been strictly enforcing that rule. Members have been allowed to be delinquent in dues for up to two years before being dropped. In June we dropped all members who had not paid dues for two years. The Board has directed us to enforce the By-laws, so in August we will be dropping members who have not paid 2007 dues.

Because of complications resulting from the change in the dues cycle (from fiscal to annual) that we began with the half-year billing in June 2006, we ran into difficulty when some members overpaid in 2006 and had a credit on their accounts. QuickBooks did not correctly generate some of the 2007 bills and/or reflect the payment of dues received in 2007. Thus, some members received duplicate bills or bills for incorrect amounts. We apologize for the inconvenience and are working very hard to eliminate these problems when we convert to our new membership database and billing system – we'll see how successful that is when you receive your 2008 bills!

In the past year we received 89 new applications, slightly above the 80 applications received last year. I have approved 60 new lineage memberships (down from 90 the previous year). Seventeen lineage applications have been closed because of inactivity and one was rejected because of an error in the line. There are 100 pending applications.

The update to the Alden Kin Database was published last fall. It represents additions to the database through September 1, 2006. This year I have been pursuing records of all Alden men in such on-line databases as the World War I and World War II draft registrations. I have also been tracing matrilineal Alden lines – unbroken female descents from Priscilla.

There has been no progress on the fourth volume of the *Mayflower Families Through Five Generations* on the descendants of Ruth (Alden) Bass, but I am now making a push to have it done by the end of the year.

My thanks to all applicants for their patience while we process lineage papers and to Assistant Genealogist Bonnie for keeping up with all of the “boy’s” applications.

Education Committee Report

This past year the Education Committee had three meetings, two in the winter and one this spring. At these meetings, programs were assessed and modified and planning for the new year was begun. .

The “Adventures in Time” summer history camp format from last year which was fairly successful was modified for this year to include some different activities and scheduling was also changed. This year’s camp was changed to be later in the summer than last year’s camp (the week of July 17th). Also a major advertising campaign was planned. Fliers advertising the camp were distributed to local schools and libraries. Press releases were made in the local papers and a slide show featuring last year’s campers was played on the local cable station. However, when the date of the camp had arrived there had only been a few inquiries but no commitments for signing up for the camp. Due to lack of interest the decision was made to cancel the camp for this year. The education committee will meet to discuss reasons why the camp did not attract anyone this year.

Our outreach program was much more successful. Linda Osborne visited eleven kindergarten classes in Pembroke. By comparing tools and household items of the 1800’s with the modern day equivalent children were able to get a feel of what it was like to live in the 19th Century. The program is very hands on and gives the children a chance handle artifacts from the period and see how different life was in the past as compared to today.

The Education Committee will reconvene in the Fall to discuss present programs and also begin to think about developing other new programs for the Alden Historic Site.
